Home construction lags behind demand

A recent Harvard
University report found

inching higher, housing
construction and supply
aren't keeping pace
with demand.

- Single-family housing starts have been below 1 million units for 11 consecutive years
- Household growth increased to 1.2 million new households per year
- Rising land prices and a shrinking construction labor pool = shortage of middle-market housing
